Check for leaking pipes

Method: You can easily do this by turning off all taps at the end of the day (after all leaks are repaired) and take a reading of the water meter. At the beginning of the next day (the longer the period of time the better) read the water meter again BEFORE anyone has used water. There should be little or no difference between two readings. If there is a significant difference check for leaks again and a pipe may require repair.
